Dear Mr. Althen:

This is the third and final response to your January 15, 2010, Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for records of HHS Secretary Kathleen Sebelius concerning meetings with the White House on health care legislation from January 7, 2010 to the present.

The Office of the Secretary, Scheduling Office (OSSO) and Immediate Office of the Secretary (IOS) conducted a search and located 31 pages of responsive records, of which 22 pages of responsive records are enclosed. Nine of the 31 located pages originated within The White House, Executive Office of the President. I have determined to withhold portions of the released records under FOIA exemptions (b)(2)(high), (b)(5), and (b)(6); and the nine pages of responsive records, in their entirety, which originated within The White House, Executive Office of the President, under FOIA exemption (b)(5).

The FOIA exemption (b)(2) (high) allows the withholding of records, if released, would risk circumvention of a legal requirement such as that based in law and agency regulation. Such materials are intended for use by Federal personnel (such as reviewers, examiners and/or investigators). The FOIA exemption (b)(5) permits the withholding of information which contains intra-agency and/or inter-agency communications which document the deliberative process. The FOIA exemption (b)(6) permits the withholding of records, if released, would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of personal privacy.

If you believe that the information withheld should not be exempt from disclosure, you have the right to appeal. Your appeal must be sent 30 days from the date of receipt of this letter, to the Deputy Assistant Secretary for Public Affairs (Media), U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Mary E. Switzer Building, 330 C Street, S.W., Room 2221, Washington, DC 20201. Clearly mark both the envelope and your letter "Freedom of Information Act Appeal."
